



REOPENING OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Updated to reflect changes announced on 6 June 2020

FIRST PHASE: 10 May 2020 to 23 May 2020

- Restaurants, food establishments and street vendors can open but must be closed by 8:00 p.m.
- No dining-in allowed
- Hardware stores open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Groceries and supermarkets to close at 6:00 p.m.
- Pharmacies to close at 8:00 p.m.
- No hand shaking, kissing or hugging
- Outdoor activities such as exercising, walking, hiking and running allowed providing people stay six feet away from the next person. No team and contact sports and activities requiring gatherings of more than five persons allowed
- Religious institutions remain closed
- Gyms and bars remain closed
- WITCO, TCL and Nu-Iron allowed to resume operations
- Stay-at-home order remains in effect
- Public transportation operations at 50 percent capacity continue

SECOND PHASE: 21 May 2020 to 31 May 2020

- Entire manufacturing and construction sectors to return to work
- Auto repair shops, parts shops, tyre shops, laundry and dry-cleaning services reopen
- Borders remain closed except for the managed entry of persons, including UWI students from all campuses across the Caribbean
- Domestic workers to remain at home
- Spas, hairdressers, barber shops, religious institutions, pubs, cinemas and others remain closed
- Public transportation operations at 50 percent capacity continue

THIRD PHASE: 1 June 2020 to 7 June 2020

- All retail businesses can reopen but must be closed by 6:00 p.m.
- Entire public service returns to work
- Hotels with outdoor dining facilities allowed to serve guests
- Public transport operations at 50 percent capacity continue
- Professional service providers can resume work
- Air transport to Tobago to resume to meet the demand for flights
- All the activities of the National Lotteries Control Board (NLCB) to resume
- Gatherings should not exceed five persons
- Funerals allowed to have up to ten persons

FOURTH PHASE: 8 June 2020 to 21 June 2020

- Gatherings now increased from five persons to ten persons
- Reopening of spas, hairdressing salons, barber shops
- Domestic workers can return to work
- Public transportation operations increase to 75 percent capacity
- Reopening of religious institutions on 11 June 2020. Recommended that religious activities be held for one hour, those attending wear masks and adhere to other Public Health guidelines
